Near East Side awarded federal grant money

U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Secretary Shaun Donovan traveled to Columbus on June 30 to announce that 4 communities will receive a combined \$119.7 million to redevelop severely distressed public or HUD-assisted housing and bring comprehensive neighborhood revitalization to blighted areas. Development will include mixed-income housing units, a food hub, job centers, and other neighborhood amenities. The Near East Side will receive \$30 million, and Mayor Michael B. Coleman expects the results to be transformational.
