Casey's Thoughts on Crime in Eastgate

Eastgate residents have seen an increase in criminal activity in recent months. We have experienced thefts from vehicles, attempted and successful break-ins, and gun fire. In response to this, Eastgate Garden and Civic Association will draft a letter to the Nelson Park apartments and the Columbus City Attorney asking for cooperation in finding solutions to these issues. This letter will be available for comment at the October 6th neighborhood meeting and ALL residents are encouraged to attend. Residents are encouraged to empower themselves by writing their own letters to the city attorney expressing concerns and asking for cooperation on solutions.

Most importantly, residents have to remain vigilant and do our parts to make Eastgate a safer place. You need to report suspicious activity to 911 or the non-emergency number: (614) 645-4545. You need to make sure security lights are working at night and that windows and doors are secure, especially when you're not home. If street lights are out, it is your responsibility as an Eastgate resident to report that via the 311 application on your smartphone, the website: 311.columbus.gov or the 311 hotline: (614) 645-3111.

The recent crimes against our neighbors have mostly been crimes of convenience. We need to make our neighborhood inconvenient for criminals and let them know we are watching.
