Did you know?

The **City of Columbus has a free app, My Columbus,** for mobile phones allowing residents enhanced access to community resources. It encompasses 4 mayoral initiatives: My Neighborhood, Get Active, Get Green, and 311.

The My Neighborhood campaign allows residents to access COTA bus schedules, learn about Neighborhood Pride areas and events, and view Health Inspections of area restaurants, markets, pools, spas, and tattoo parlors.

The Get Active initiative enables residents to access information about parks, community centers, golf courses, pools, and sports facilities. You can also view an events calendar and get park and trail guides.

The Get Green initiative encourages sustainable behavior with environmental facts and pointers in addition to information on what restaurants, business and non-profit organizations are GreenSpot members.

The app also includes a 311 service center submission section where residents can submit and check on the status of service requests from their mobile devices. In addition, residents can enter their address in the settings to customize the app to send push notifications about trash, recycling, and yard waste days.
